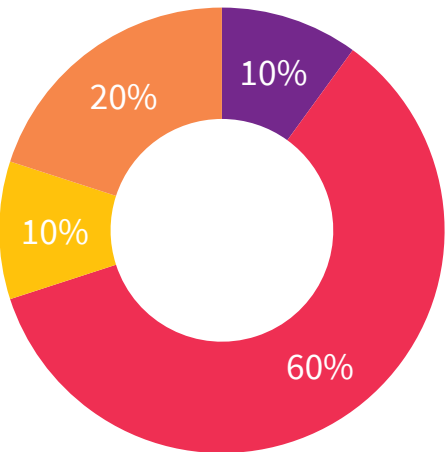

Type of activity



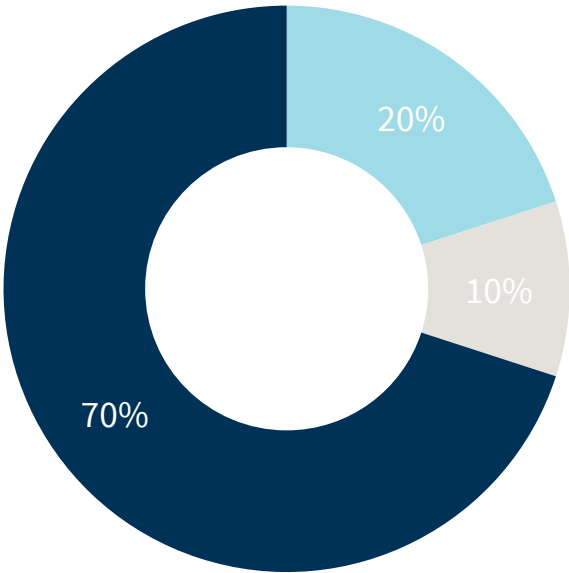
Fundraising: an event whose primary purpose is to raise money for a community partner

Community Partners Highlights

Fondation Collège Champittet

The Collège Champittet Foundation, which celebrates its 10th anniversary this year, is entirely autonomous from private school Collège Champittet or Nord Anglia Education, from whom it only receives support, but never contributes to financially.

The Foundation has its own legal identity and is registered with the official commerce registry. Members of its committee represent the school management, parents, pupils as well as teachers.

The Foundation has two complementary objectives:

- Support humanitarian projects mainly in education
- Raise awareness among our students about the situation of poorer countries, make them better individuals and citizens

The Foundation supports 2 kinds of projects: long-term school-related projects and one-off projects with a more general charitable purpose.

Association Avotra

The region of Befotka (Berafia) is amongst the least developed of Madagascar. The inhabitants of the

different villages offered Père Stefano 10 hectares of land to plant eucalyptus and acacia trees, chosen because of the arid land. Along with other villages, the Avotra Association was created and a program of reforestation and improvement of methods for rice cultivation was started.

Past projects included the creation of a nursery, a dam for irrigation and a mechanical workshop, a primary and a secondary school, and the construction and operation of a dispensary for schools and surrounding villages.

Children First

The principle focus of these projects are the education and healthcare of children more specifically orphans or abandoned children as well as the refurbishment of the main hospital for the District of Ambanja (200,000 people) situated in Northern Madagascar.

Rotary members believe that we have a shared responsibility to act on our world's most persistent issues. Our 35,000+ clubs work together to:

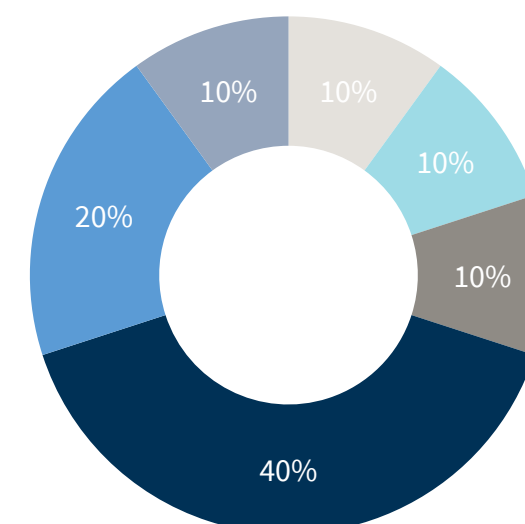

The foundation is born in 1984 on the demand of the president of the local Tribunal of the time to have a reliable and safe place in town to lodge and raise abandoned children or orphans. Père Stefano Scaringella has been overseeing the well being of the children since the creation of 'La Maison des Enfants' in Ambanja. The foundation opened in 2013 its second house in Tananarive for children from 14 y.o. where they get to follow secondary studies and apprenticeships. 143 children are currently being taken cared of between Tananarive and Ambanja.

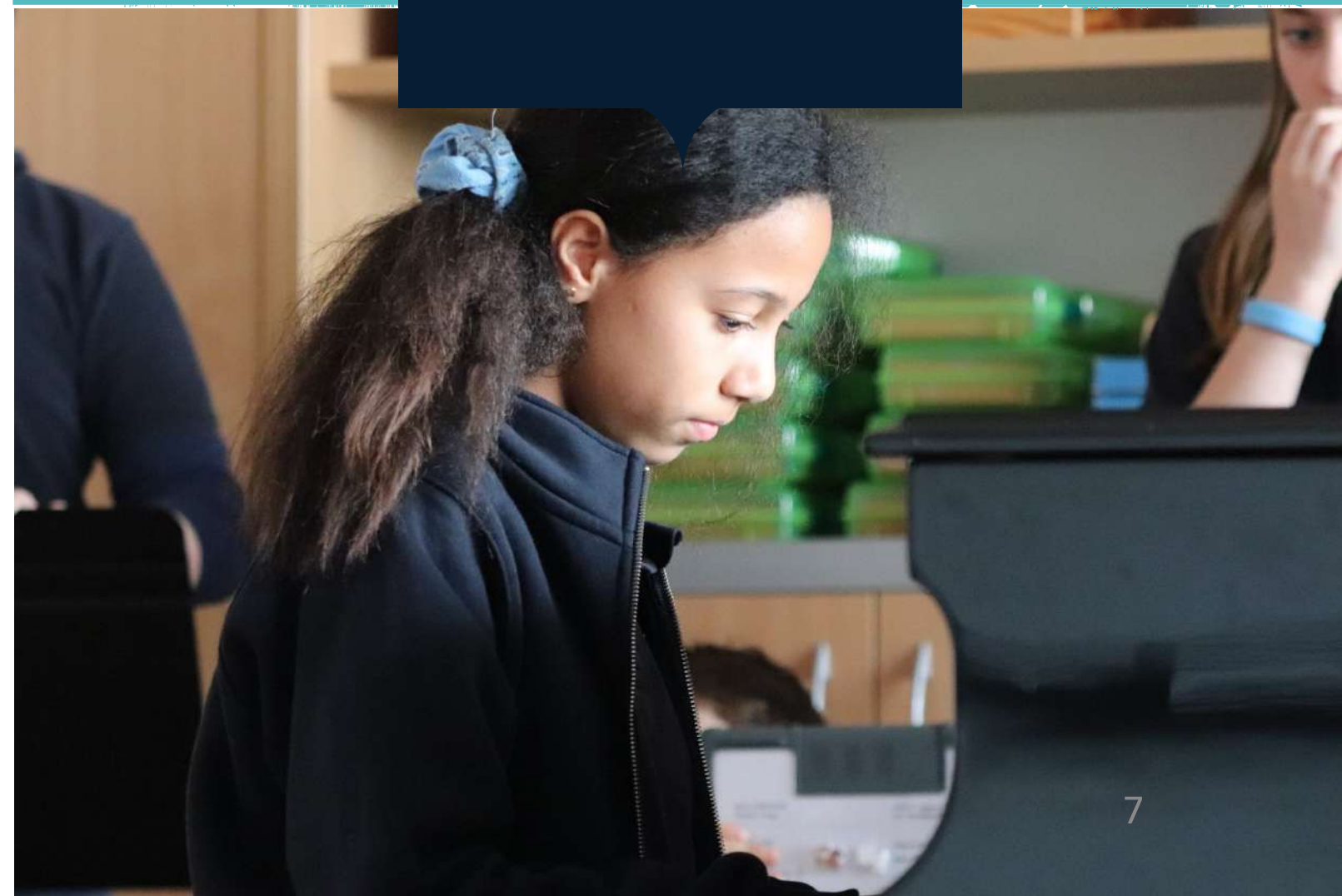
Charity concerts in favor of the Collège Champittet Foundation

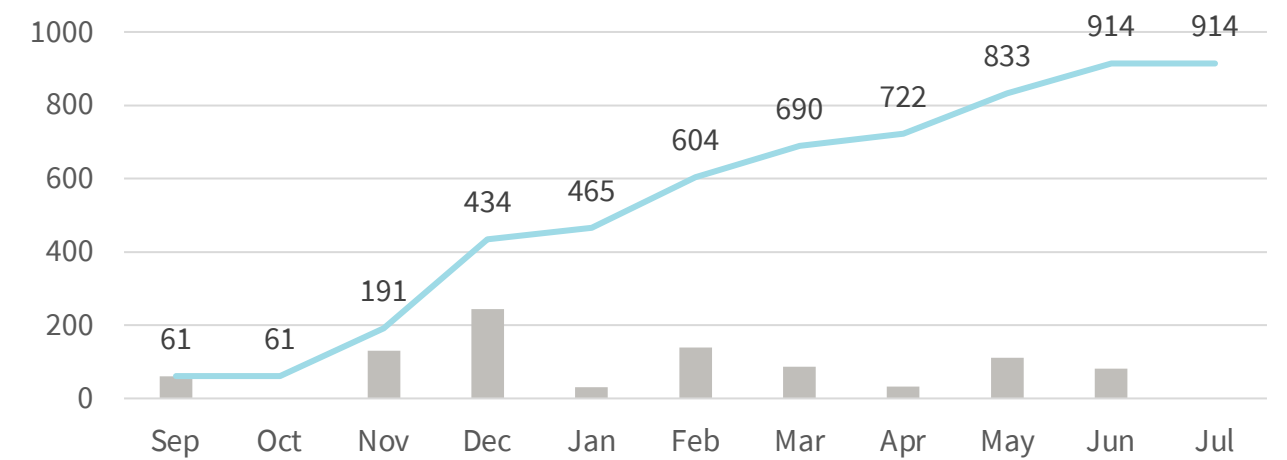

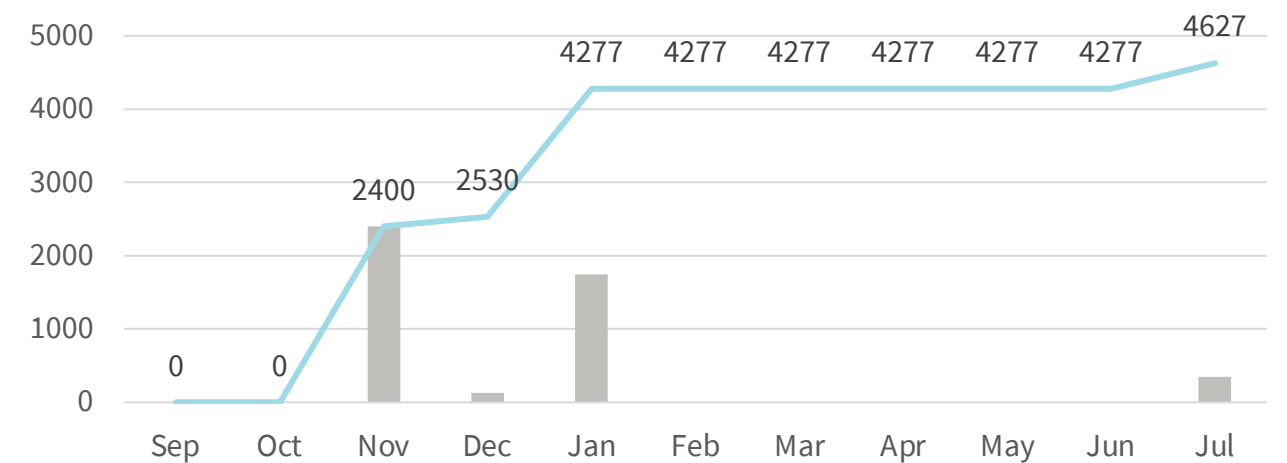
